Report to the INSSAR House of Delegates

2013 Dues -

The 2013 dues collection process is well underway, with all the Chapters receiving their kits. Special congratulations to the Simon Kenton Chapter for turning in 100% of its 2013 dues already!

New Member Applications –

The INSSAR is having a banner year. We are close to doubling the records of new applicants (2011) of 57. This is because of the hard work of everyone in Indiana. You are working hard, and it is paying off. It is critical that all applications that we receive meet the published standards from NSSAR. Some of our applications are starting to not hit those standards at 100%. Let's make sure that they are always "Approval Ready."

Two areas that remain trouble hot spots:

- 1. Checks for National needs to be made to: **NSSAR Treasurer General** (we see all kinds of incorrect checks and this become a problem for National to cash them.
- 2. Family Plan In order for the discount to work it must:
 - a. All the members of the family plan must be submitted at the same time as the original applicant, which they are coming in under.
 - b. Have ALL the members of the family plan on one Check to NSSAR Treasurer General.

Membership Renewal/Drop -

With your help, the INSSAR has gained some ground in reclaiming those members who have dropped. Now that we are entering the 2013 dues collection process, let us make every effort to ensure we do not lose the ground we have gained. It is also a good time to gain even more ground by inviting those members who dropped over the last several years to rejoin. Invite your Chapter members to call them, send them notes, etc. – let them know we miss them.

NSSAR Fall Leadership -

Thanks to <u>Hubert Shackleton</u>, who prepared <u>"Honoring Revolutionary War Veterans Buried in Warren County, Indiana"</u>, which took place on 4 July this year. Thanks also to <u>George Frantz</u>, William Henry Harrison Chapter, <u>who submitted a finished pamphlet</u> to Ron Burkhart for <u>inclusion in the Warren County</u> folder.

A dedication was held in the St. Paul Lutheran Church in Bartholomew County on 4 August this year for Patriots Nicholas Jones and John Carney.

As you may know, the VA rejected the headstone order for James Anderson, buried in Sanborn Cemetery, Knox County, IN. An attempt to get the VA stone is now in the hands Sanborn Cemetery Trustees. Ed Hitchcock well monitor this procedure.

A headstone has been set for John Phillips – Greene County – Dedication TBA for spring 2012.

The stone at the grave of Patriot Jacob Kepler in Graves Cemetery in Perry County was set many years ago and is still in good condition. The cemetery has a lot of small briars and saplings that need to be cut. In addition, an access to the cemetery is need. The township trustee has been requested to help resolve this cemetery problem – no response has been received. Supervision of the problem still continues.

A VA headstone has been received for John Carpenter. The patriot is buried in Hicks Cemetery, Owen County – near Freedom, IN. Dedication ceremony is TBA for 2013.

Mark Owens has reported that the headstone for William Stewart in Stewart Cemetery, Washington County, IN has been set. Dedication is planned by John Hay Chapter for 2013.

John McBride, PS, NC is buried in McBride Cemetery, Lawrence County, IN. VA prohibits a stone for anybody not a soldier; therefore Elliott Stone Company has volunteered to make the headstone for patriot John McBride.

Edward Hitchcock is working on finishing the procedures for ordering headstones.

Mark Kreps is developing classes pertaining to the "25 Most Prominent Patriots in Indiana". Presentations will be in Power Point slide. Suggestions are welcome.

October 11, Ed Hitchcock and Ron Burkhart went to Dearborn and Ohio counties where they talked to the County Veterans Service Officers relative to patriot graves. Ed and Ron also visited Nathan Ricketts headstone. Pieces of the headstone were found a couple of years ago

on private property in Ohio County, IN. In 2011, half of the old headstone for Nathan Ricketts was refurbished. A government headstone is being ordered for dedication in 2013.

There are 2,241 names in my working database – this database is no to be misconstrued as the INSSAR Patriot Graves database located on the INSSAR web site.

From 2009 to 2012, we have a listing of 30 patriot names who did not appear in the INSSAR Patriot Graves web site. The search for all patriots, particularly new finds, is ongoing.

The following compatriots have volunteered to devote time researching counties in Indiana:

<u>Brad Manzenberger</u> – Johnson, Shelby, Henry, Marion and Jennings counties; <u>Phil</u>

<u>Greenwood</u> – Marion county; <u>Jim Arnold</u> – Morgan county; <u>Allen Manning</u> – Jefferson county; A possible research volunteer is <u>David Jenkins</u> – Warrick, Spencer, Perry, Posey and Vanderburgh counties.

From 2009 to 2012, as per my database, there has been 190 patriots whose cemetery locations, documentation, and photos have been completed.

When you find those Rev War headstones, record the GPS readings for patriot graves and cemeteries.

It appears that the following counties are either completed or near completion: Switzerland, Ohio, Perry, Warrick, Spencer, Sullivan, Gibson, Rush, Decatur. **The new ones to the list are: Ohio, Brown, Dubois, Brown, Morgan, Greene, Washington, Lawrence, Jackson, Orange, Daviess, and Pike.**

We would like to know if there are other compatriots who may be working on researching patriots graves. If so, please contact Ron Burkhart at burkhart@indiana.edu

We are still interested in keeping track of grave dedication conducted in Indiana. Please contact Ron Burkhart.

NSSAR - Proposed medals for participants in Patriot Grave Markings is still on pending – Jim Arnold appears to be the person knowledgeable on the subject requirements.

Revolutionary soldier, Blaze Robertson, was supposedly buried in Robertson Cemetery in Jackson county, and there is a stone for him in the cemetery. Brad Manzenberger stated this stone is a memorial headstone which indicates Blaze Robertson is buried in Virginia.

INSSAR Veterans Committee Report

Subj: October 2012 State Meeting Reports

<u>The WWII Corps</u> has been replaced by the Veterans Recognition Committee Chaired by Colonel Charles T. (Chuck) Sweeney, USMC, Retired. The Indiana Society will be represented by SFC James C. (Jim) Arnold, US Army, Retired. The purpose of this committee is to continue to honor those that have served in a conflict for the United States.

The next round of honor will be the Korean Veterans. In order for members of the INSSAR to receive the certificate from NSSAR they must have received the Korean War Service Medal or the Korean Defense Service Medal. <u>Chapter Secretaries</u> start sending <u>the Veterans</u> <u>Battalion Survey</u> to the Veterans in your Chapters and follow instruction on the form.

2014 will be the Vietnam War Veterans to receive the NSSAR Certificate you must have received the Vietnam Service Medal. Vietnam Era does NOT count. More information will be forthcomeing at the Spring Leadership meeting to be held on March 01, 2013.

We are working on how to recognize those that fall in between WWII, Korea and Vietnam i.e. China Service July 7, 1937- Sept 1939 and Sept 2, 1945-April 01, 1957, Berlin Occupation May 9, 1945-Oct 2, 1990, Italian Occupation May 9, 1945-Sept 15, 1947, Austria Occupation May 9, 1945-July 27, 1955, Korean Occupation Sept 3, 1945-April 27, 1949 and Japan Occupation Sept 3, 1945-April 27, 1952. Naval Occupation Italy (same as above) Trieste May 8, 1945-Oct 25, 1947, Austria (same as above) Asiatic/Pacific Sept 2, 1945-April 27, 1952. The medals that must have been received are the Army of Occupation-Europe Medal, Army of Occupation-Far East Medal and the Navy Occupation Service Medal. The INSSAR Veterans Recognition Chairman will check each completed survey to determine what certificates the Compatriot will receive.

<u>Patriot Graves Marking Medal</u> - At the Fall Leadership meeting held on September 28, 2012 the Patriot Graves Marking Medal was approved. The requirements are (as far as I know of) that your name must be on the program and that the events start as of January 01, 2011. More should be coming from the Medals Committee at the March 2013 Spring Leadership Meeting. Keep reading the SAR Magazine for updates. For INSSAR the De La Balme and Fort Sackville (Vincennes) ceremony each year is to be counted along with other memorial at battle sites that you attend. Members that attended the Fort Laurens, Ohio and Battle Days in West Virginia will count.

<u>Wreaths Across America</u> program is in full swing. In order for your chapter to to be registered go to www.wreathsacrossamerica.org. Once your registered you will be given a "Sponsoring Group ID Number" and you can select a National Cemetery in Indiana from the four that are listed. They are; Crown Hill National Cemetery (INCHNI), Indianapolis,

Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery, Madison, Indiana (Daniel Guthrie, David Benton and John Hay Chapters have this one) Marion National Cemetery (INMNCM), Marion, Indiana and New Albany National Cemetery (INNANC), New Albany, Indiana. WAA is part of the NSSAR Patriotic Outreach Committee.

<u>Defense Prisoner of War/Missing Personnel Office</u>...www.dtic.mil/dpmo/ is where you can go and get the most up to date information on POW/MIA personnel. You will also find the most current POW/MIA's that have been identified, the units they belonged to and when and where they will be buried.
